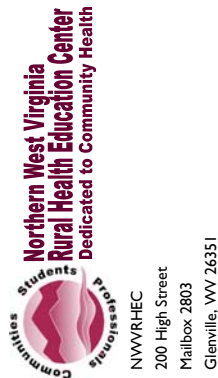

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The purpose of this program is to provide information on four key issues in HIV care today. Acute HIV Disease mimics most acute viral illnesses, therefore detection and early diagnosis requires special attention. The Initial Encounter between a newly diagnosed HIV patient and the health care provider provides a foundation of data upon which all future visits will build. Health care maintenance of HIV infected persons is often delivered by primary care practitioners in the US. This program also describes HIV Testing in the United States and the Legal Issues surrounding care of the HIV infected individual.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this program, participants should be able to:

1. Describe the clinical presentation, testing procedure diagnosis, treatment and secondary prevention issues surrounding Acute HIV Infection.
2. Describe the assessment and evaluation of a newly diagnosed HIV infected individual.
3. Discuss the role and responsibilities regarding primary care of the person living with HIV disease.
4. List types of HIV antibody tests available for detection of HIV disease.
5. Discuss the recommendations for HIV Testing of Adults, Adolescents and Pregnant Women in the U.S.
6. Describe the legal issues surrounding confidentiality, disposition of records and HIV reporting in WV.

SPEAKERS

Jeannette Southerly, RN ACRN is the Site Director and an HIV educator for the WV Local Performance Site of the PA/Mid Atlantic AIDS Education & Training Center. She has been on staff since 1990 and has presented HIV/AIDS programs throughout the State for more than 16 years. Jeannette has also presented abstracts at national and international programs on HIV/AIDS.

Carolyn Kidd, RN, BSN has been a Clinical Nurse Educator for the WV Local Performance Site since 2002, and brings home health HIV/AIDS experience to the program. Carolyn has also presented abstracts at regional and national conferences.

The West Virginia Local Performance Site at West Virginia University is part of the Pennsylvania/Mid Atlantic AIDS Education & Training Center and provides HIV/AIDS-related training and technical assistance to health care providers in the State.
